When it comes to fleas, prevention is the key! So beat the flea this spring and make sure your pet (and all pets in the household) are protected.



Unfortunately, it was just at the time of the first warm winter day, that time we see our first blowflies sneaking into the kitchen.

Any animal that has soiled fur or a wound is at risk of blowfly strike, even dogs. This is what happened to Marley. He was suddenly quite sore around his bottom, and he started to smell. He was seen by Dr Sarah who had the misfortune of clipping his coat and some maggots in half as well! That's hard to stomach when you're not expecting it!

Fortunately, Marley's owner brought him in quickly before the strike was extensive. Marley was sedated so that his very sore skin could be clipped short and treated without causing too much distress. After a nice bath and blow-dry and with some pain medication and antibiotics, he felt like a new dog!

This is a timely reminder to check your animal friends daily, especially if they have long coats, and to consider having them clipped before the blowfly season.
